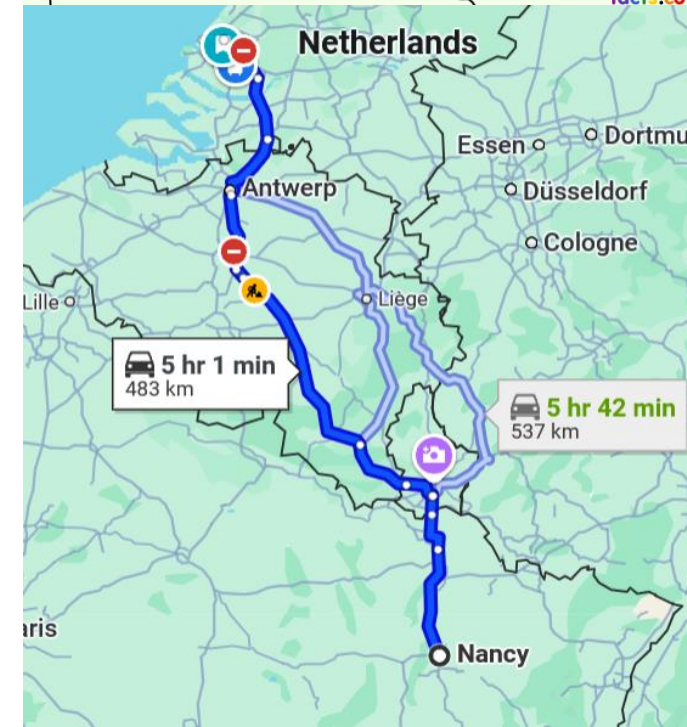


Welcome to Delft

Welcome to TU Delft

- 27,000 students (including 6,500 foreign students)
- Top 20 technological universities in the world
- One of the world's largest campuses (161 hectares)

there are foodtrucks and also cafeterias in each faculty, where you can discover world's flavours (Vietnamese, Italian,...) for approximatively 10€

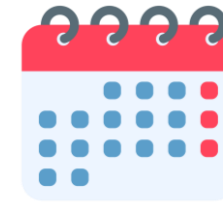

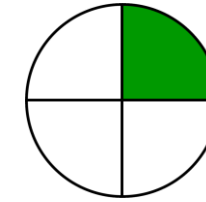

groupworks



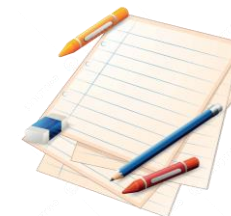
10h-16h of classes per week

each quarter

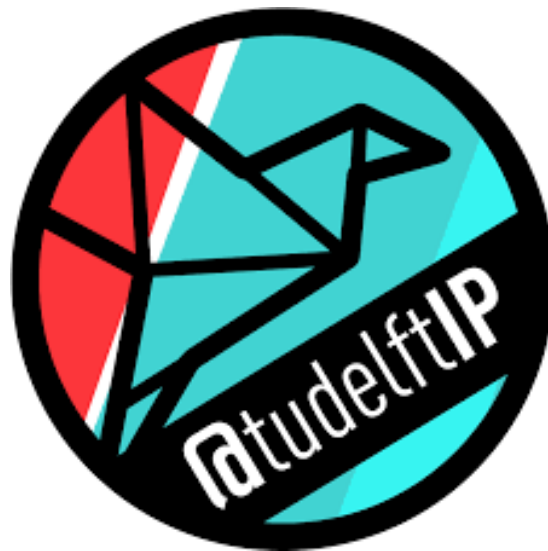


Sometimes, classes can

Administrative procedures

- Get a BSN (citizen service number) at the municipality: mandatory when you stay in the Netherlands more than 4 months
- Create a Digid ID : useful to create a bank account and get housing benefits
- Create a dutch bank account
 - Traditional banks: ABN AMRO, ING, Rabobank
 - Online banks : Revolut, Bunq
- Apply for housing benefits:
apply as early as possible, which can sometimes take a long time, but can save you 1/3 of the cost of the rent



Practical information

- Dutch people speak very good in English, they can switch easily from Dutch to English



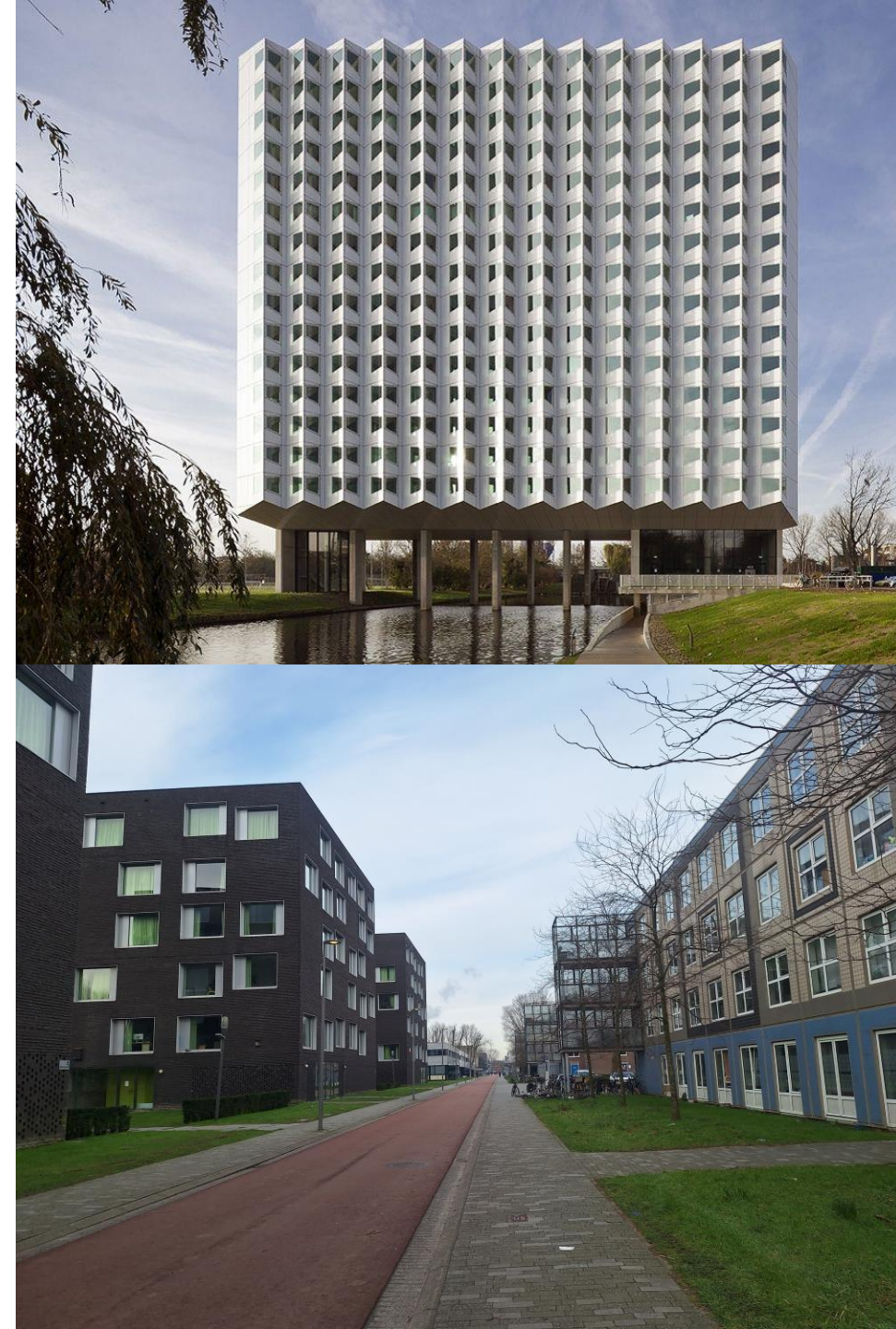
- Everyone uses a bike to move! It's often more practical than using a car. You can easily rent or buy one



Housing



- Very difficult to find an accomodation !
- I advice you to pay the service proposed by TU : you pay 280€ and DUWO (a housing platform) selects some rooms for you, then you just have to choose one
- so don't delay in registration, because it's first come, first paid, first served!
- It'll often be individual room with shared facilities (shared bathroom, kitchen) but it's also possible to get an individual room with included facilities with more a expensive rent



Activities



X TU Delft is in my opinion the coolest place in the campus : you can do activities like sport, gym, arts, music, cooking, and meet people ! They also have a café and terrasse, and sport fields (tennis, beach volley, football...)
